

**Notice of General Election
and
Sample Ballots
November 6, 2018**

OFFICE OF THE GREEN COUNTY CLERK
TO THE VOTERS OF GREEN COUNTY:

Notice is hereby given of a general election to be held in Green County, on November 6, 2018, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office to be voted for, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office and under the appropriate party or other designation, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, in the sample ballot below.

INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place, a voter shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles. If a voter is not registered to vote, a voter may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence if the voter provides proof of residence. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall retire alone to a voting booth or machine and cast his or her ballot except that a voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device ("ImageCast Evolution-ICE")* to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen at the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, the voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting device. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

Under state law, the increase in the levy of the Town of Decatur for the tax to be imposed for the next fiscal year, 2019, is limited to 0.727%, which results in a levy of \$281,741. Shall the Town of Decatur be allowed to exceed this limit and increase the levy for the next fiscal year, 2019, for the purpose of establishing a curbside garbage and recycling collection program in the Town of Decatur, by a total of 37.05%, which results in a levy of \$386,131?

"Under state law, the increase in the levy of the Village of Monticello for the tax to be imposed for the next fiscal year 2018, is limited to 0.0%, which results in a levy of \$325,498, before any debt adjustments. Shall the Village of Monticello be allowed to exceed this limit and increase the levy for the next five fiscal years by \$218,000, beginning fiscal year 2018 the purpose for which the increased levy will be used is public works and public safety capital equipment/vehicles, operational costs for public works street maintenance, employee retention, Administrative Assistant position, safety training, computers/software, pool maintenance and equipment, and cemetery maintenance and expansion expenses over the next five years, by an approximate total of 66.5%, prior to any debt service adjustments, for a total Village tax levy of \$543,498?
